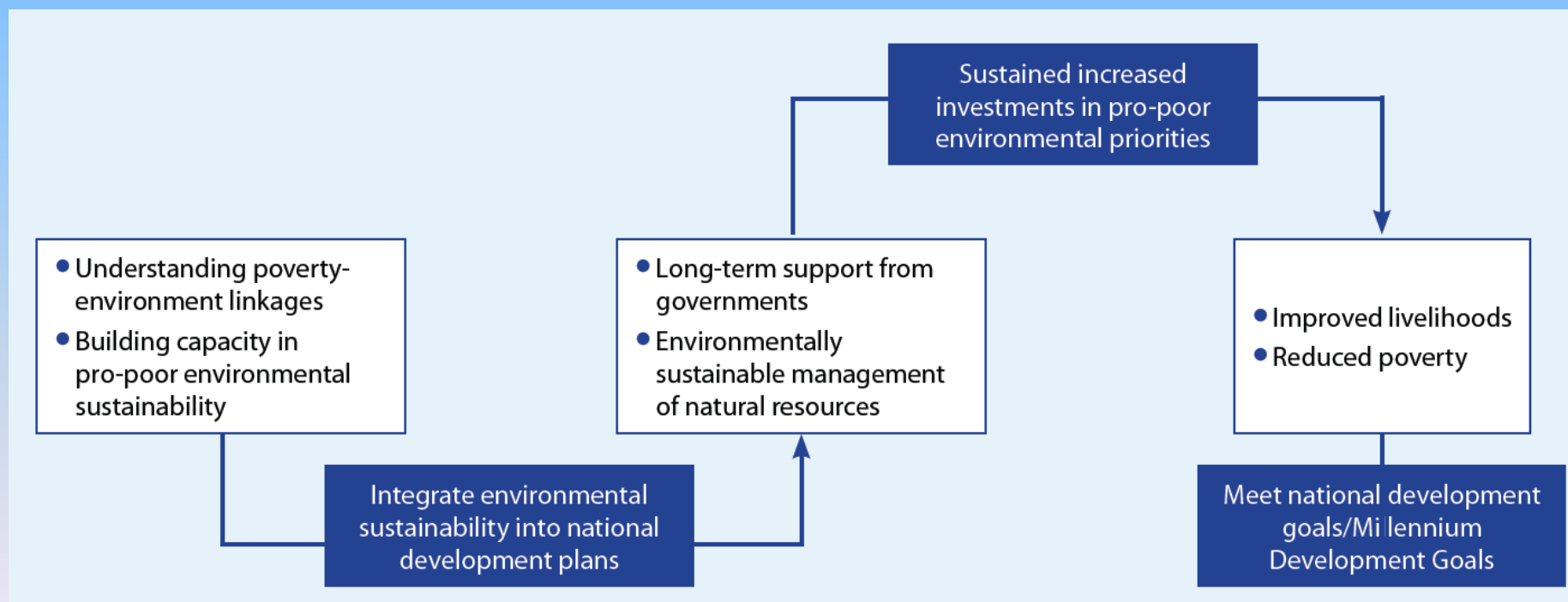

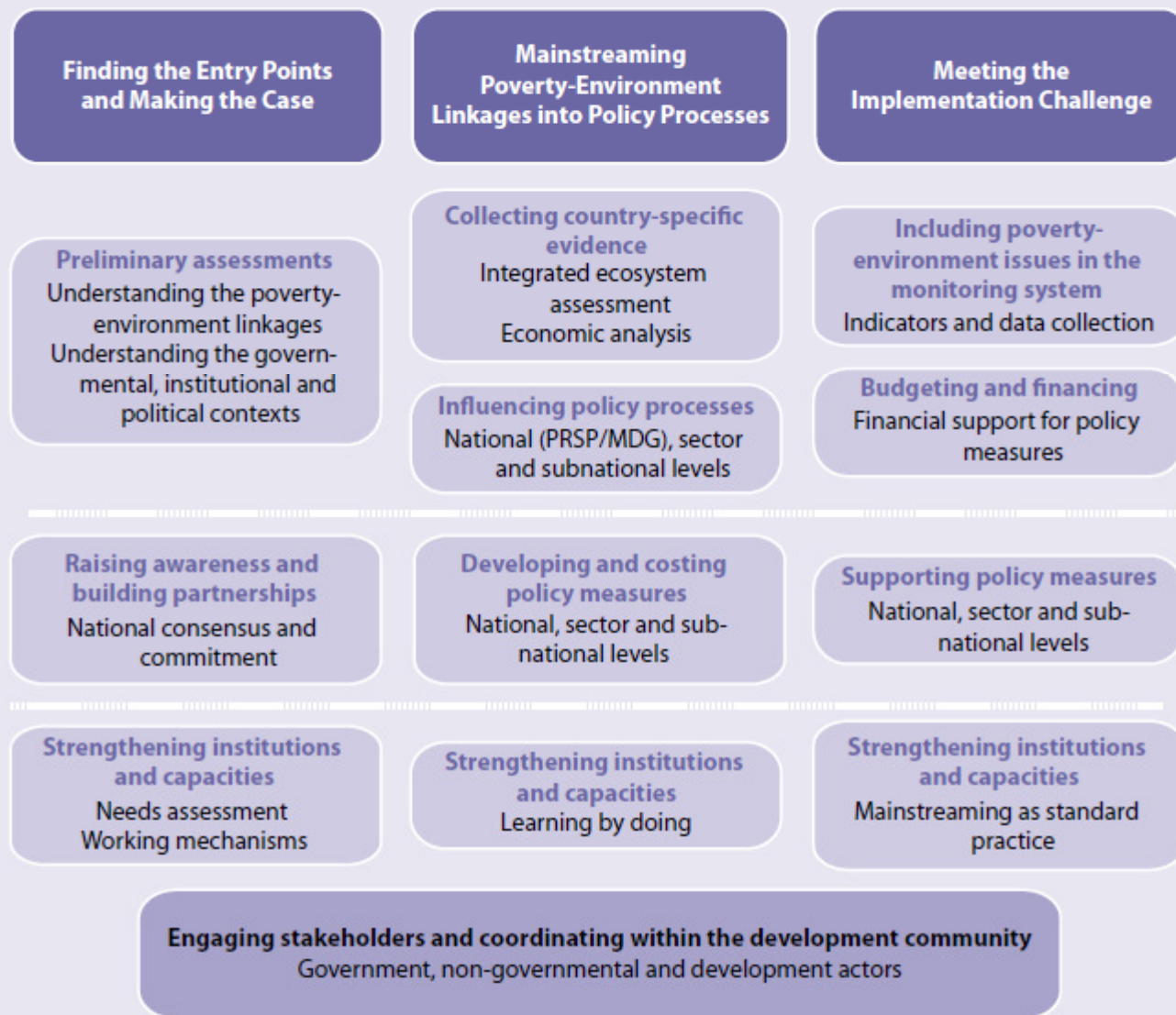

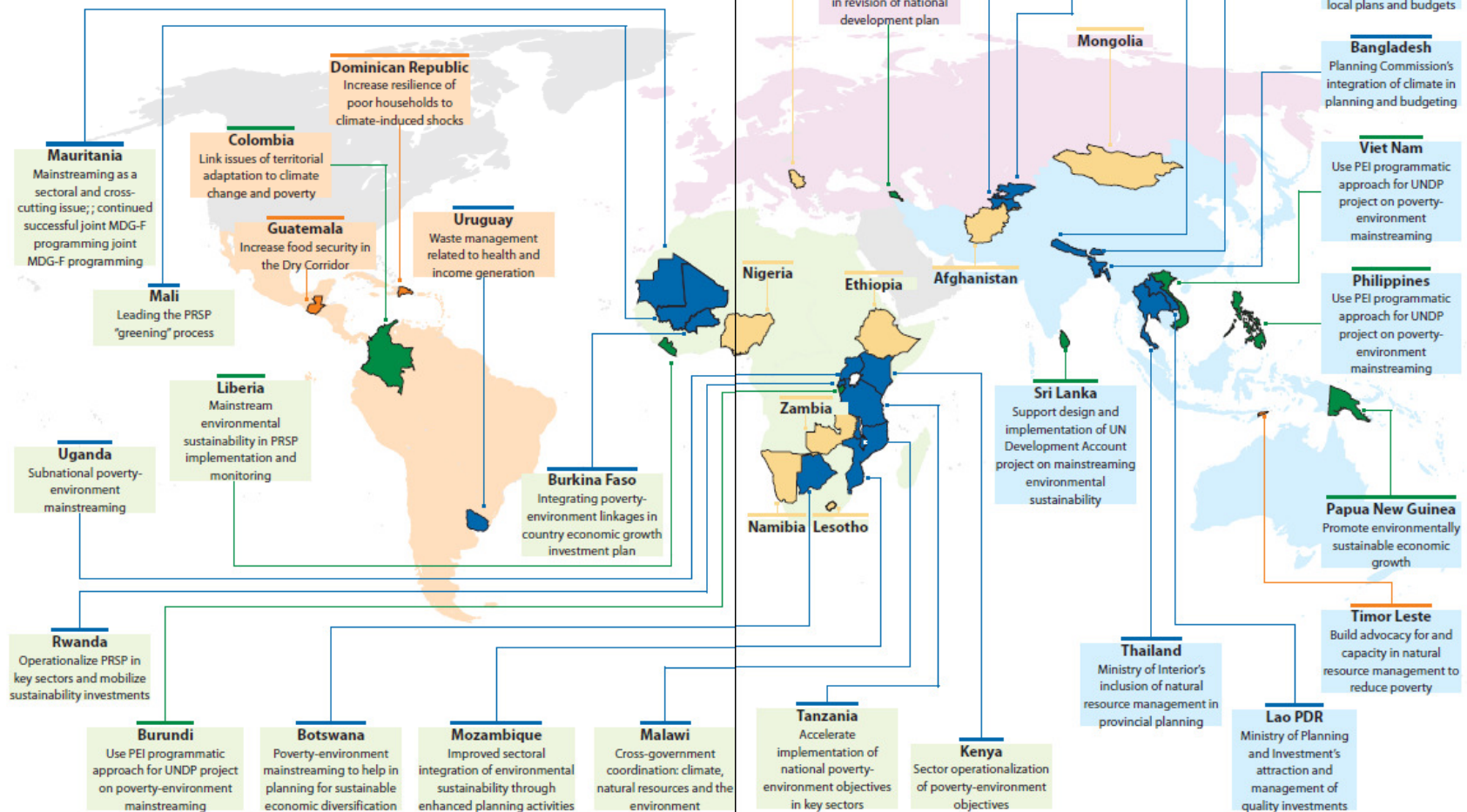
Figure 3.1 Programmatic Approach to Poverty-Environment Mainstreaming

PEI Lessons learned



- **Focus on key Ministries that oversee planning and finance**
 - Ministries of Planning and Finance in collaboration with Ministries responsible for environment.
 - Understand the economic development planning cycle, the Medium term expenditure frameworks (MTEF) and the national M&E systems, and roles of the executive and legislative.

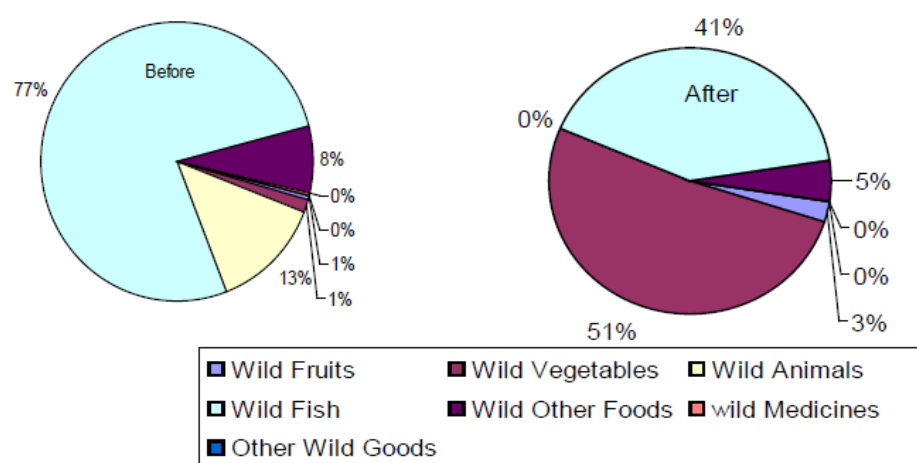
Achievement: P-E objectives & indicators included in national and/or sub-nat'l dev. plans in 10 countries.

- **Generate evidence to make the case and inform reform process**
 - Economic assessments of environment and NR sectors & contributions to livelihoods and economy: *Maximising use of available data, CBA, PER*
 - Integrated ecosystem and human well – being assessments: *Mixed results*

Pilot Ecosystem Assessment – Rwanda

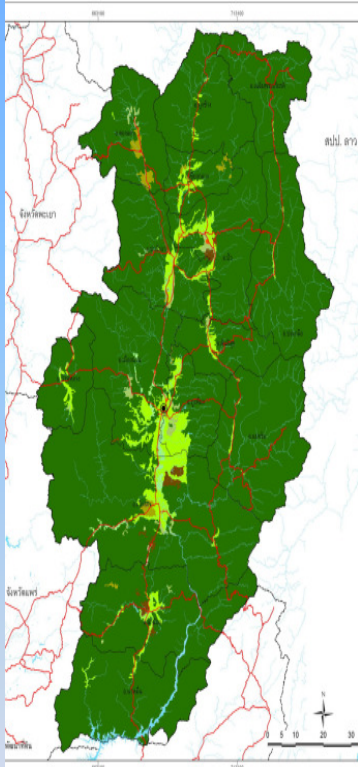

 - Decreased livelihoods

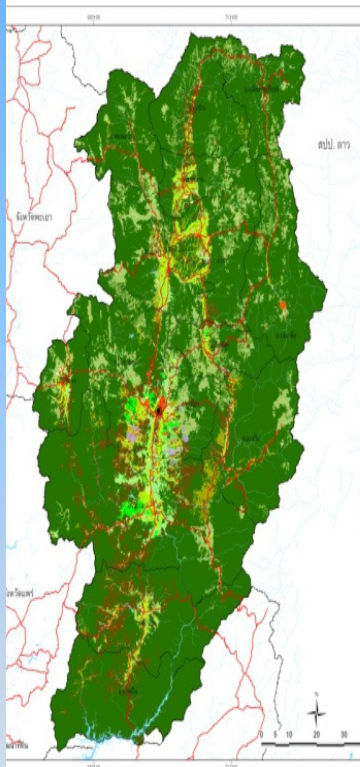


SGA – PEI Thailand– Nan province

Policy question:
How can the Provincial Development Policy better integrate agricultural development centred on **commercial crops with conservation efforts** to both enhance well-being and maintain ecosystem services?

Lessons Learned (Contd.)

- **Develop trust and meet decision-maker needs.**
 - Understand the motivation and policy decision-making process.
 - Establish credibility and develop trust.
- **Country and regional focus to capacity building.**
 - Champions within Govt, civil society and private sector
“Ambassadors” in Burkina Faso, Mali, Rwanda
 - Strength national discourse: working through the media
 - “Learning by doing” and focus on cross-sectoral
- **Improvements needed in:** poverty and gender focus, M&E (outcomes), mainstreaming PE into the host agencies plans and operations
